James Madison, President of the United States,
 To all and singular to whom these Presents shall come,
 Greeting:

Whereas a Treaty of Peace and friendship between
 the United States and the Fox Pule or Nation
 of

of Indians was made & concluded at Portage
des Sioux on the fourteenth day of September,
one thousand eight hundred & fifteen, by
Commissioners on the part of the United States,
and the King, Chiefs & Warriors of the said Tribes
or Nation of Indians, on the part of the said Tribes
or Nation, which Treaty is in the words following,
to wit:

A Treaty of Peace and Friendship made and concluded between William Clark, Minian Edwards and Auguste Chouteau, Commissioners Plenipotentiary of the United States of America, on the part and behalf of the said States of the one part; and the undersigned King, Chiefs and Warriors of the Fox Tribe or Nation, on the part and behalf of the said Tribe or Nation of the other part.

The Parties being desirous of re-establishing Peace and Friendship between the United States and the said Tribe or Nation, and of being placed in all things and in every respect on the same footing upon which they stood before the war, have agreed to the following Articles.

Art; I. Every injury or act of hostility by one or either of the contracting Parties against the other shall be mutually forgiven and forgot.

Art; II. There shall be perpetual Peace and Friendship between the Citizens of the United States of America, and all the individuals composing the said Fox Tribe or Nation.

Art; III. The contracting Parties do hereby agree, promise and oblig themselves reciprocally, to deliver up all the Prisoners now in their hands (by what means soever the same may have come into their possession) to the Officer commanding at Fort Clark on the Illinois river, to be by him restored to their respective Nations as soon as it may be practicable.

Art; IV. The said Fox Tribe or Nation do hereby agree to, recognize, re-establish and confirm the Treaty of 1796, which was concluded on the third day of November one thousand eight hundred and four, to the full extent of their interest in the same, as well as all other Contracts and Agreements between the Parties. And the United States promise to fulfil all the stipulations contained in the said Treaty in favour of the said Fox Tribe or Nation.

In Witness whereof, the said William Clark, Minian Edwards and Auguste Chouteau, Commissioners as aforesaid, and the aforesaid King, Chiefs and Warriors of the Fox Tribe or Nation aforesaid, have hereunto subscribed their names and affixed their seals this fourteenth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, and of the Independence of the United States the Fortieth.

of Washington this twenty
sixth day of December, in
the year One thousand eight
hundred & fifteen.
